The students shared views on the topic and we discussed how they feel about calling out racism. 






Monarto Zoo Excursion

Attendance







- before 1 May can start school in term 1
- between 1 May and 31
 October can start school in term 3 (mid-year intake)
- after 31 October can start the next year.

Children who start school at the beginning of the year will complete 4 terms of reception.

Children who start school in a mid-year intake will complete 6 terms of reception.






